Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to a new term! It has been great to see the children returning to school with smiles on their faces and the sun shining! I hope that as we move towards the end of the school year, we can continue to return to some normality...

I wanted to write to you to share our updated Personal, Social, Health Education (PSHE) policy which has been updated to include how we are teaching Relationships and Sex Education (RSE). - referred to as 'human reproduction'. This policy is available to view on the school website (under parents - policies) or click <https://bit.ly/2P5nFTp> to view.

As a school we are using an award winning scheme called 'Jigsaw' to teach our PSHE and RSE lessons. This is to ensure we are teaching all statutory content in line with DFE expectations. Jigsaw is the preferred scheme for many primary schools in England and further details can be found here: <https://bit.ly/3dyiTaf>

This term the children will be covering the 'Changing Me' unit of work and this includes the teaching of puberty which is a statutory requirement of Health Education. It is also important for you to know you have a right to request that your child be withdrawn from PSHE lessons that explicitly teach sex education/human reproduction. In this unit of work, this will be covered in:

- Year 4, Lesson 2 (Having a baby)
- Year 5, Lesson 4 (Conception)
- Year 6, Lesson 3 (Conception, birth)

If you have any questions or indeed would like to request your child does not take part in the RSE parts of these lessons, please feel free to make contact with either myself or class teachers. As we go through the year, we will share details of each new topic theme each term. I hope this is useful to you...
